TO CHASSIS NO. 14837 FOR MODELS EQUIPPED WITH EXHAUST.

The Renold MCD chain tensioner (Fig. 21) is of the self-adjusting type and therefore the chain does not require periodic tightening.


It is accessible from the outside of the engine. In case of its replacement, remove cover 3. Unscrew bolt 5 from the timing case side and extract tensioner 6. Install the new tensioner making sure that spring 9 is installed in the position of maximum compression and tighten bolt 5.

Then install cover 3 and after loosening locknut 1, tighten tensioner peg 2 until mak-

ing light contact with the tensioner.

Insert a screwdriver through the hole for cap 8, rotate the plastic release lever 7 until it releases. The chain tensioner is now adjusted for normal operation. Whenever light chain noise is noticed, loosen the locknut 1 and with a wrench either tighten or

loosen the tensioner peg as required. Then re-tighten the lock nut.



NOTE

In the turning over of the engine in reverse firing order, it will be noticed that the flywheel rotation/travel distance is greater before activating the camshafts.

1-Lock nut; 2-Tensioner peg; 3-Cover; 4kelease


lever; 8-Cap; 9-Spring; 10-Dowel

The tensioner unit is made up of chain guide 5 which pivots on bolt 6, support 3 which



houses spring 4 pressing the tensioner unit against the chain is bolted to the engine block. To adjust the tensioner, warm up the engine, loosen lock nut 1 and tighten adjustor 2 until the chain begins to become noisy.

Loosen the adjustor & turn and tighten the lock nut.
